EXPLORE humanity's reach for the skies, and the pivotal role of Riverside's historic **MARCH FIELD** in the development of flight. **SEE** early aircraft, including the 1903 pioneer which launched the era of powered flight, World War II bombing icons and Cold War fighters, an MQ-1 Predator, and more. **FIND** something for everyone in your family at the March Field Air Museum.

Riverside National Cemetery

is the third-largest cemetery managed by the National Cemetery Administration, and since 2000 has been the most active in the system based on the number of interments. It was established in 1976 through the transfer of 740



acres from March Air Force Base, which during World War II was called the U.S. Army's Camp William G. Haan. The cemetery was dedicated and opened for burials Nov. 11, 1978. An additional 181 acres was transferred by the Air Force in 2003.
